FROM OUR CHAIR

In 2022, our crisis line received more calls than ever as families in our community were faced with a national formula shortage, an increase in diaper prices due to inflation and the unrelenting rising cost of living in our area. With your generosity and support, we met this rising demand for our services and delivered hope to thousands of families in need in King and Snohomish counties.

This past year has also been one of transition and growth for Babies of Homelessness. With new leadership and the addition of several new

board members, we have been able to increase our capacity as an organization and enhance our service offerings to better support our families. This has included expanding our services further into Snohomish and South King County.

Along with new distribution sites and strategic partnerships with local organizations, we have been able to provide even more families with the essentials they need to care for their young children.

As we look to the future, we are excited about the opportunities that lie ahead for Babies of Homelessness. We remain committed to our mission of making sure no child goes without the basic necessities they need to thrive, and we are determined to continue to expand our impact and reach even more families in need.

FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



2022 was an eventful year for Babies of Homelessness. We welcomed new voices to our team and board, expanded our services, streamlined our processes, and improved our organization in many ways. We also reached a bittersweet milestone when we delivered our 1 millionth total diaper. This moment showed just how great of a positive impact we have on families in our region, but was also a clear sign that diaper need continues to swell.

With this ever-increasing need in mind, expanding access to our services was an important theme in 2022.

Making it simple for families to obtain basic needs has always been our goal, with direct delivery and “no red tape” setting us apart. This year, we added family pickup to that list: clients can now meet our van at strategically located pickup spots to receive their monthly supply of diapers, always within reach of public transit. This has allowed us to broaden our boundaries and serve hundreds more families than direct delivery alone.

Another theme of 2022: sweeping change among our staff and board. Babies of Homelessness added five new board members, each offering their own unique experience, story, and connection to our community. The diversity of voices on our board is now one of our greatest assets. We also brought on board our first intern - a former BoH client who was inspired to use her personal experience to support families in the community facing hardship as she had.

Finally, we had a change at the Executive Director position; while transitions like this present challenges for a small non-profit, our former ED, Brittan Stockert, left us with a healthy organization that was set up for success.

What lies ahead for BoH? We will expand access to our services even further by better communicating with non-English speakers and adding family pick-up locations. We will develop additional partnerships, especially in underserved areas in Snohomish and South King County.

As always, we will listen closely to what our community and clients are telling us they need, and act to serve them accordingly. We will also continue to take important steps to ensure we support diversity, inclusion, and equity in all things we do.

Of course, none of this is possible without the generous support of our volunteers and donors. With so many nonprofits to choose from, it's amazing that so many share their resources with BoH. Your support means a lot, and reinforces our dedication to this mission.
