What We Do

From day one, Babies of Homelessness has stood for compassion, dignity, and access without barriers. We believe support should feel empowering—not overwhelming. That's why we do things differently.

Families come to us directly—no referrals, no paperwork, no appointments. Just a quick, respectful intake. We deliver more each time, so families return less often. And when they do, we meet them where they are—at accessible pickup sites or through trusted partners offering even more help. By removing obstacles, we strengthen impact. By offering choice, we restore power. Because every family deserves more than just help—they deserve hope.

I'll never forget—and will always be so grateful—for everything this program has done for my family. Every time I go to pick up, I'm genuinely happy to see the workers. Letter From Leadership

To our amazing supporters:

In 2024, Babies of Homelessness continued to grow, deepening our impact, expanding our reach, and strengthening the support we provide to families experiencing homelessness or living with low income. Thanks to the generous support of our grantors and the community, we formed new partnerships and extended our services across King and Snohomish Counties. These collaborations have enabled us to reach more families than ever before with the essentials they need to care for their babies: diapers, wipes, and formula.

Spending a day at one of our pickup sites brings everything into focus. You see the relief in a mother's eyes as she collects diapers for her 20-month-old twins. You hear the quiet resolve in a father's voice as he shares his plans to keep searching for work, despite the uncertainty. You feel the pride of a toddler, arms wrapped around a box of wipes, helping his mom carry their family's essentials to the car.

These moments are real. They are raw. And they are made possible because of you. Families we serve survive on less than \$18,000 a year. Many are navigating the lasting impacts of homelessness, housing instability, job loss, divorce, trauma, or displacement. Essentials like diapers, wipes, and formula aren't just helpful—they're life-changing. They offer dignity, provide stability, and allow parents to breathe, even if just for a moment. - A mom transitioning out of living in a safe car park with her twins.
- A father of eight finding the courage to rebuild.
- A joyful dad showing off his newborn daughter's tiny, pink stroller.
- A community of parents, speaking different languages, but sharing one universal dream: a better future for their children.

They're not asking for a handout—they're reaching for hope. And you are the hand reaching back. Because of your continued support, we show up week after week with more than just supplies. We show up with compassion, consistency, and the reminder that no one is alone.

But our work isn't done. In fact, it's never been more urgent. Several human service organizations may not survive the coming months. That's not just a funding gap—it's a crisis. If they go dark, families go without. We can't let that happen.

This is your impact. Every dollar you give, every story you share, every person you bring into our community is a part of this powerful ripple effect. Together, we deliver more than diapers—we deliver hope, resilience, and the promise of a stronger tomorrow.



Providing To Our Littlest Neighbors

"Our partnership with Babies of Homelessness has made a meaningful change. We've been able to consistently provide diapers to the littlest of our neighbors—and that has made all the difference. It's hard enough to imagine living in these conditions as an adult. But to see children—and especially infants—growing up in these circumstances is truly heartbreaking. The cost of diapering a baby is incredibly high.

As a new mother myself, I now understand this more deeply than ever. When I first began volunteering, I had no idea how great the need truly was. I quickly learned that something as simple as a clean diaper can have a profound impact on the daily life of a family experiencing homelessness. Diapers are essential to a baby's health and comfort, yet they're often overlooked when food and shelter are in such short supply. The importance of human dignity, especially during times of homelessness, is something that will always be close to my heart. Even the tiniest members of our community—those too young to speak—deserve every bit of dignity and care that any of us do."
